APPROVAL OF PROCEDURE

Based on Article 19.1 of the Law on Firearms, ORDERS as follows:

1. To approve the procedure on import of firearms, ammunition and firearm-like devices across the state border by citizens and legal entities licensed to import, sell and engage in sports and training activities.

2. To instruct the General Police Department / Chief Commissioner R.Chinggis / and the General Customs Agency /O.Ganbat/ to implement the order.

**Procedure on importing and selling firearms, ammunition and similar devices,
and state border crossing of firearms, ammunition and similar devices by citizen
and legal entities with sports-training activity**

One. General grounds

1.1. The Law on Firearms , Government Resolution No. 219 of 2002 and other laws on the entry of firearms, ammunition and firearm-like devices across the state border by a licensee specified in Articles 16.1, 16.2 and 16.5 of the Law on Firearms . legislation and this regulation.

1.2. A person licensed to import and sell firearms, ammunition and firearm-like devices to the public shall be a person licensed to import, sell and manufacture firearms, ammunition and firearm-like devices, ammunition and firearms for civil and security purposes. Citizens and legal entities licensed to engage in sports and training activities shall bring firearms and ammunition for sports and training purposes across the state border.

1.3. Firearms of a licensed citizen or legal entity specified in 1.2 of this regulation shall be included in the list specified in Article 4.2 of the Law on Firearms and firearm-like means in the list specified in Article 5.5 of this Law.

**Two. Apply for and review permission to allow firearms, ammunition and firearm-like
devices to cross the state border**

2.1. The application for permission to import firearms, ammunition and firearm-like devices for civilian and security purposes shall be approved by the Government Resolution No. 219 of 2002. It shall be issued in the form “E” of “MNS 5022: 2001” standard specified in Annex 1.

2.2. A licensed legal entity shall attach the following documents to the application for permission to allow firearms and ammunition to cross the state border in addition to those specified in paragraph 2.2 of the “Procedure for issuing export and import licenses for goods crossing the state border under state control”:

2.2.1. A reference from an organization that sells firearms, ammunition and firearm-like devices to the public, and a legal entity licensed to import, sell and manufacture ammunition;

2.2.2. A written request of a member of the Government in charge of sports who contains information specified in Article 19.6 of the Law on Firearms by a citizen or legal entity licensed to conduct sports and training activities.

2.3. The name and type of firearms, ammunition and firearm-like devices imported into the state border by a citizen or legal entity applying for a permit to allow firearms, ammunition and firearm-like devices to cross the state border. Indicate the year of manufacture, purpose, brand, number, technical and other parameters.

2.4. Depending on the specifics of the firearm, ammunition and firearm-like device to be issued a permit, other necessary definitions and conclusions may be issued by the citizen or legal entity requesting the permit.

2.5. The Commission specified in Article 16.3 of the Law on Firearms shall review the application and attached documents within 14 working days after receiving it and issue an opinion.

2.6. The Commission shall review the application of a citizen or legal entity requesting a permit in accordance with the "Procedure for issuing export and import licenses for goods crossing the state border under state control".

The member of the Government in charge of legal affairs shall decide whether to issue a permit to allow firearms and ammunition to cross the state border based on the commission's opinion.

2.8. The member of the Government in charge of legal affairs shall issue a permit to allow firearms and ammunition to cross the state border in the form, time and form specified in 2.6 and 2.7 of the "Procedure for issuing export and import licenses for goods crossing the state border under state control".

Third . Customs inspection for import of firearms, ammunition and firearm-like devices across the state border

3.1. Citizens and legal entities who have obtained a permit to import firearms, ammunition and firearm-like devices across the state border shall submit a declaration of goods to be crossed the Customs frontier together with documents required by the Customs in accordance with the Customs legislation.

3.2. The Customs and the Commission shall receive the declaration together with the relevant documents, inspect the documents and goods in accordance with the Customs legislation and decide whether to bring firearms, ammunition and firearm-like devices into the Customs territory.

3.3. The Customs and the Commission shall make a note on the permit for firearms, ammunition and firearm-like means imported across the state border and attach it to the Customs declaration.

3.4. The Customs Department and Committee shall submit "Information on import of firearms, ammunition and firearm-like devices across the state border" to the Customs Responsibility Unit of the Customs Headquarters by the 30th of each month.

3.5. The Customs Inspection Unit shall compile the information and submit it to the Crime Prevention Unit of the Central Police by the 5th of the following month.

3.6. Firearms, ammunition and firearm-like devices confiscated or detained for inspection purposes due to violation of Customs legislation shall be immediately submitted to the Customs Headquarters.

Four. Others

It shall be prohibited to allow firearms, ammunition and firearm-like devices to cross the state border through others.

4.2. The crime control unit of the Central Police shall monitor whether the firearms, ammunition and firearm-like devices are registered in the unified state register by citizens and legal entities who have obtained permission to allow firearms, ammunition and firearm-like devices across the state border.

4.3 If the person who violated the legislation is not subject to criminal liability, the authorized officer of the police and customs shall be held liable in accordance with the legislation.
